FROM THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

You may be reading this as a printed copy passed to you by your local secretary, or passed on by a member, at a WI meeting or at home. You may be reading this electronically from a link forwarded by your secretary or from the DFWI website. Whichever way we hope you are enjoying keeping up to date with Federation activities and news from other WIs. During Covid restrictions we were unable to produce and circulate printed copies and many members were happy to receive their copies electronically. Some missed their printed copies and the opportunity to chat with



others about their plans to attend events and courses.

Since the lifting of restrictions we have circulated printed copies to each WI as well as electronic copies with no charge. As we move forward WIs have been asked to order and pay for printed and/or electronic copies for their members. A printed copy will cost $\pounds 4.00$ per member per year while a digital copy will cost $\pounds 1.00$ per member per year.

Most have ordered a combination of both to suit members' preferences. We now need to consider how the federation can continue to produce this cost effectively, whilst also recognising the need to avoid wasteful use of paper. Various proposals will be discussed by the Board of Trustees so we can come to a solution which is fair to all.

Our aim is to make sure as many members as possible read and enjoy the magazine.


DORSET FEDERATION QUIZ FINAL

How about a Virtual WI for Dorset?

There will be a **Zoom Meeting on Thursday 18 November at 19.30** to explore whether there is any interest in this. All are welcome. So far about eight other Federations have successfully started Virtual WIs. Over lockdown Zoom has become used more widely and for some WI members a Virtual WI may be an option. A Virtual WI would suit those who cannot get to face to face meetings: perhaps there is not a WI close to where they live, or work commitments prevent them attending.

A Virtual WI is for anyone whether a current WI member or not. We are widely advertising this new venture and hope to attract ladies who are not current WI members. Perhaps those in a garrison environment who move around and this would give them the opportunity to belong to a WI and keep in touch wherever they are posted to. Or a WI member may move away and still want to keep a link to Dorset. A virtual member can live anywhere in the country or even abroad.

A Virtual WI will be run on exactly the same lines as any other WI. The newly revised Constitution allows for virtual meetings. A committee will be elected to run the WI. As Advisers we will be around to support and guide the WI. Dual membership gives anyone the chance to continue as a member at their current WI and also be a member of the Virtual WI.

ACWW - A DEFINING MOMENT

The Association of Country Women of the World was founded in 1929, and membership spans 82 countries. Since 1947 we have passed 180 policy resolutions. The National Federation passed a resolution in 1935 that WIs would support the work of ACWW and Pennies for Friendship was started to help fund the organisation. Rural women are the backbone of their families, of communities, of



nations, and of global food systems. In many countries they bear the burden of conflict, go unheard in legislation and remain unprotected and unsupported, ACWW exists to change all this. In her speech to the recent United Nations Women's Conference, the World President Magdie de Kock concluded by saying "today I recommit ACWW to amplifying the voices of indigenous women, of old women, of rural women, of young women and all those in non-urban communities who cannot be heard above the din of chaos or are silenced by global inaction".

We are incredibly proud of our diverse network of women's organisations globally and the women who lead development projects we have supported over the past 50 years.

CHIDEOCK WI

SWANAGE WI

A NEW WINEEDS A BANNER

On 24th February 2021 a banner competition was launched. Members were invited to design a banner that would represent Swanage WI. Four designs were submitted and members were invited to vote by secret ballot for their design choice.

The design chosen by members had easily recognisable local images including a Swan, Old Harry Rocks and ammonites. The date of the formation of the group in 2020 was acknowledged and a rainbow included as thanks and recognition of all of those in the NHS for their work during 2020.

The first meeting was held in The 1859 Pier Cafe where we introduced each other and explored what skills the group had in crafting. These skills included wet felting, embroidery, stump work, quilting, appliqué, beadwork, and both hand and machine sewing.

The cost of making the banner was kept to a minimum by recycling resources that we all had at home.

We discussed changes that we might make to the colours on the design with the consent of the designer who was in the group. These changes included adding WI to the original design and rather than the text being white, the group decided to include the colours of the LGBT community to make the banner all inclusive.

A pattern in black and white was made and at the next

meeting the members took different pieces to work on using different techniques. We then met a month later and shared what we had created. We had seven meetings in total during the year and met at various places including one member's home, The Shark Cafe and The Grand Hotel in Swanage.

The group members have really enjoyed creating the banner, especially as it was the first social event that many of the group had been to following the confines of lockdown. It has been enjoyable chatting over tea coffee and cake and learning new crafting skills.

One of the members had an idea for the finials on the pole that supports the banner, to be shaped like swans. A volunteer at the Greengage Community Allotment Project who whittles wood crafted two swans for the group which he kindly donated and a member's husband made the pole for the banner to hang on.

The group have now decided to meet as a sewing and craft group to learn about and share more skills, and continue to develop more projects to benefit Swanage WI.

Thanks go to all of those involved and particularly The Grand Hotel who gave us refreshments, The Greengage Project for the swans and Brendan who made the pole for the banner.
