# REPAIR, REPURPOSE, RESUSE

Set up initially by **Stoborough WI** to try to help people to live more sustainably. Sustainable Wareham has grown to include many supporters in the wider Wareham area. Repair Cafés nationwide focus on preventing items from adding to landfill, and we were delighted to host two such Cafés recently. A fully established group offers a wide variety of repairs to all sorts of items, but our events started smaller, with Men's Shed giving advice on tools, and talented WI members offering sewing repairs. One man watched the elbow of his sweater being darned and then sat and repaired the other elbow himself. A perfect example of preventing waste and passing on skills. This has generated requests for machine sewing lessons, which will be met by a course being run locally. The "Repair, Repurpose, Reuse" ethos will reduce waste, overconsumption and planned
