CLIMATE CHANGE IN ACTION

There really is action on Climate Change happening in several different countries simultaneously!

Dutch trains are now run entirely on wind power. One windmill running for an hour can power a train for 120 miles. The trains make 5,500 trips every day with 600,000 passengers commuting every day and no carbon emissions.

On the roads there are also advances: recovered cooking oil is being used for powering HGV vehicles instead of diesel oil – less polluting and saving oil being poured down drains!



A Norwegian company is planning to build affordable homes from 100% recycled plastic across Africa in collaboration with the UN, 2800 houses per annum are needed – the project is planned to start in 2022. Only 9% 0f plastic is currently recycled with most going to landfill – and landing up in our oceans.

A nano-powered battery is planned within 5 years, made from nuclear waste. The goal is to 'reinvent' electricity – ridding the world of fossil fuels by 2040. Bristol University has already developed a prototype – it just needs more investigation to create more power.

Water to the Navajo Nation - solar powered hydro-panels are delivering up to 10 litres of water per day to each household. 45 countries are benefitting from this technology.

Sadly, it's not all good news. The Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change (IPCC) warns of drastic climate changes in the next 30 years already there is rain falling instead of snow in Greenland – seven billion tons of water falling on the ice sheet contributing to global warming.

There are things we can change – 1.4 million wearable school uniforms are thrown away each year. Some parents don't want their children to have second hand. Other parents can't afford new. Can we help change minds? Tell me what you are doing to help combat Climate Change – I will print your replies in my next article. My email is carb2home@gmail.com.




